Tour Itinerary

Day – 1 | Delhi Haridwar | (220kms/7-8hr)

In morning, Our driver will pick from Delhi. Drive towards Haridwar. You will reached at Haridwar. Transfer to your hotel. Visit Har-ki-Pauri for Ganga Aarti in evening. Back to your hotel for overnight stay. **Haridwar**, lying at the feet of Shiva's hills, i.e., Shivaliks, in the Haridwar district of Uttaranchal Pradesh, is a doorway. Suryavanshi prince Bhagirath performed penance here to salvage the souls of his ancestors who had perished due to the curse of sage Kapila. The penance was answered and the river Ganga trickled forth forms Lord Shiva's locks and its bountiful water revived the sixty thousand sons of king Sagara. In the traditional of Bhagirath, devout Hindus stand in the sacred waters here, praying for salvation of their departed elder. It is doorway to the sources of the Ganga and the Yamuna, 3000 to 4500 meters up into the snowy ranges of the central Himalayas. The 'Aarti' worship of the Ganga after sunset and the floating 'dia' is a moving ritual.

Day – 2 | Haridwar Barkot | (220kms/6-7hr)

Early in the morning after breakfast at the hotel then drive to Barkot via Dehradun & Mussoorie. Enroute visit Kempty Fall and others later drive straight to your hotel for overnight stay. Barkot is the nearest place where we can stay and go for Yamunotri Darshan next Day.

Day – 3 | Barkot Janaki Chatti Yamunotri Janaki Chatti Barkot |

Drive to Jankichatti, trek start from here to Yamunotri (6kms). Either by walk or by horse or by Doli at own cost. Arrival in Yamunotri, One can cook rice by packing it in a cloth and dipping it in the hot water of the hot kund. Pilgrims take this cooked rice home as "Prasad". Here near the temple "Pooja" can be offered to Divya Shila, after taking bath in Jamunabai Kund's warn water and having "Darshan" of pious "Yamunaji" returning to Jankichatti. Later drive back to Barkot. Overnight stay at Hotel. **Yamunotri Temple:** Maharani Gularia of Jaipur built the temple in the 19th Century. It was destroyed twice in the present century and rebuilt again.

Surya Kund: There are a Number of thermal springs in the vicinity of the temple, which flows into numerous pools. The most important of these is Surya Kund. **Divya Shila:** A powerful rock pillar located near the Surya Kund at Yamunotri, Divya Shila presents an ethereal feeling to the devotees. It is conventional that all the devotees should make poojas here at Divya Shila before they enter Yamunotri. Though the voyage is quite tiresome, it would fetch the devotees with a unique experience of divinity and holiness.

Day – 4 | Barkot Uttarkashi | (100kms/4hr)

Today after breakfast in the hotel in Barkot, we would drive to Uttarkashi. Upon arrival in Uttarkashi we would check in at the hotel and later at evening visit Vishwanath Temple. In the night come back to hotel for dinner and overnight stay.

Uttarkashi: Situated at the bank of river Bhagirathi. The temple of Lord Vishwanath is located here where a massive iron trident is erected.

Day – 5 | Uttarkashi  **Gangotri**  **Uttarkashi | (100kms/3-4 each side)**

We proceed to Gangotri (3048 mts), enroute we enjoy picturesque Harsil village, Bhagirathi River and the most magnificent view of the Himalayas. After Gangotri Darshan we return to Uttarkashi. Overnight stay at Uttarkashi. **Gangotri Temple:** The temple, constructed by the Gorkha General Amar Singh Thapa in the 18th Century, is situated on the right bank of Bhagirathi.

Submerged Shivling: Submerged in the river, this natural rock Shivling is the place where, according to mythology Lord Shiva sat when he received the Ganga in his matted lock. It is visible in winter months when water level decreases. **Kedar Ganga Sangam:** Around 100 Yards from the Ganga Temple flows the river Kedar Ganga. Starting from the Kedar Valle, this river meets the Bhagirathi on its left bank.

Day – 6 | Uttarkashi  **Guptkashi (220kms/8-9hr)**

Today after breakfast we would drive straight to Guptkashi. Upon arrival in Guptkashi, we would check in at the hotel, rest of the time for relax and overnight stay in the hotel in Guptkashi.

Day – 7 | Guptkashi  **Phata**  **Kedarnath**


Morning drive to Phata (Helipad), transfer to Kedarnath by Helicopter. Visit Kedarnath Temple. Same day return.

Kedarnath: The Kedarnath shrine, one of the 12 jyotirlingas of Lord Shiva, is a scenic spot situated, against Kedar is another name of Lord Shiva, the protector and the destroyer.

According to legend, the Pandavas after having won over the Kaurava in the Kurukshetra war, felt guilty of having killed their own brothers and sought the blessings of Lord Shiva for redemption. He eluded them repeatedly and while fleeing took refuge at Kedarnath in the form of a bull. On being followed he dived into the ground, leaving his hump on the surface. The remaining portions of Lord Shiva appeared at four other places and are worshipped there as his manifestations. The arms appeared at Tungnath, the face at Rudranath, the belly at Madhmaheshwar and his locks with head at Kalpeshwar. Kedarnath and the four above-mentioned shrines are treated as Panch Kedar.

Day - 8 | Kedarnath  **Phata**  **Rudraprayag (57.1Kms/2hr)**

Evening, after Temple Darshan. Board your Helicopter and reached at Phata. Further drive to Rudraprayag. Check in Hotel. Night Halt.

Day - 9 | Rudraprayag  **Badrinath (156kms/6-7hr) HT : 3133 MTS.**

Today after breakfast in the hotel we would proceed for the Badrinath via Joshimath. Check in Hotel. Later at evening visit Badrinath Temple for Aarti. Overnight stay in Badrinath.

Badrinath: one of the 'Four Dhams' is one of the most celebrated pilgrimage spots of the country and is situated at an elevation of 3,133 meters, guarded on either side by the two mountain ranges known as Nar & Narayan with the towering Neelkanth Peak providing a splendid backdrop. This revered spot was once carpeted with wild berries. Thus the place got the name "Badri van", meaning "forest of berries". **Tapt Kund:** Natural thermal springs on the bank of the river Alaknanda, where it is customary to bathe before entering the Badrinath temple.

Narad Kund: A recess in the river, near Tapt Kund, forming a pool from where the Badrinath idol was recovered. & **Brahama Kapal:** A flat platform on the bank of river Alaknanda. Hindus perform propitiating rites for their deceased ancestors. **Sheshnetra:** 1.5kms. away is a boulder having an impression of the legendary serpent, better known as the Sheshnag's eye. & **Charanpaduka:** 3kms. away is a beautiful meadow where the footprint of Lord Vishnu is seen on a boulder. Mata Murty Temple: Devoted to the mother of Sri Badrinathji. **Mana Village:** Inhabited by an Indo-Mongolian tribe, it is the last Indian village before Tibet.

Vasundhara: As the name suggests, vasundhara is a magnificent water fall. **Bhim Pul:** On the other side of Mana village, a massive rock forming a natural bridge lies over the roaring Saraswati River. **Vyas Gufa**

(cave): Near Mana Village, this is a rock-cave where Ved Vyas is believed to have composed the Mahabharata and the pauranic commentaries.

Day – 10 | Badrinath  **Rudraprayag |**

Early morning, pilgrims after having a bath in the Taptkund have the Darshan of Badrivishal. Brahamakapal is significant for Pinddan Shraddh of ancestors (Pitrus). There are other interesting sightseeing spot like Mana, Vyas Gufa, Maatamoorti, Charanpaduka, Bhimkund and the "Mukh" of the Saraswati River. Just within the three kms of Badrinathjee. Later drive back to Rudraprayag. Check in Hotel. Overnight stay. Joshimath is situated on the slopes above the confluence of the rivers Alaknanda and Dhauliganga. Of the four 'Maths' established by Adi Shankaracharya, Joshimath is the winter seat of Badrinath. The idol is brought down to Joshimath and installed in the temple for people to worship. There are many other temples in the township. The most important is the temple of Nir Singh with the idol of Lord Vishnu. The left arm of this deity is getting destroyed with time and the popular belief holds that the day the arm completely withers Badrinath valley will cease to exist and the Gods will transfer the residence into the neighboring Niti Valley at Bhavishya Badri.

Day – 11 | Rudraprayag  **Rishikesh**  **Haridwar(141 kms/4-5hrs)**

Drive to Rishikesh, the 'place of sages' is a celebrated spiritual town on the bank of Ganga and is surrounded by Shivalik range of the Himalayas on three sides. It is said that when Raibhya Rishi did hard penances, God appeared by the name of "Hrishikesh" and this area hence firth came to be known as Rishikesh. Visit Rishikesh Temples & Sight Seeing – Laxman Jhulla, Ram Jhulla, Triveni Ghat, Bharat Mandir, Shivananda Ashram, Parmarth Ashram. Stay overnight in the hotel at Haridwar.

Day – 12 | Haridwar  **Delhi (220 Km/6-7 hrs) |**

After breakfast, Check-out from the hotel. Drive towards Delhi, Reached Delhi. Our Tour services From Hindu Tirath Yatra Ends with beautiful memories.
